Colorado	Yes	We will be starting with landfills since air emission issues with landfills has been popping up a lot lately. We are putting together a guidance document to include GHG emissions for landfills. We will then be doing some outreach for landfills specifically. We will then provide a workshop or webinar on GHG emissions in general late in the summer.
Texas	No	
Tennessee	No	Is interested in potentially using documents from this committee
Washington	Yes	Washington State will be doing the implementation outreach portion later in the year or next year (right now it is normal rule making activities). We are not planning to pursue the outreach grant.

Kentucky Yes

We did a class on this back in April and it was very successful.

Kansas Yes

The KS SBEAP is working with the GHG reporting rule on a limited basis (we have a \$4000 budget). Our specialist David Carter is the contact and here is what we plan to do.

Provide technical assistance to facilities and universities on GHG calculations and methods to reduce GHG emissions.

Work with USDA, KLA, and pork producers to provide targeted outreach on CAFOs and possibly Oil/Gas producers. Continue participating in E2 workshops/fairs. Update GHG page on SBEAP Web site, emphasizing energy efficiency as a GHG reduction method, and providing a link to the EPA GHG Mandatory Reporting Rule and Applicability Tool. Maintain a situational awareness of GHG rules and regulations by reviewing and keeping updated on proposed GHG regulations issued by EPA and participating in conferences.

Illinois Some

We have some outreach on the GHG rule, including articles in our newsletter. I would be interested in what other states are doing, especially for the small

businesses that will be impacted by this.

Maine Probably

The Maine DEP has required reporting of greenhouse gases as part of our annual point source inventory since 2003, so it's not an entirely new experience for our industrial facilities. We had contemplated developing some information for our website, and are now planning to apply under the recent RFP for some funding to support a more robust outreach effort.
