Minutes:

1. Method 22 instructions – any comments from the group?

- add compass to identify direction on site drawing
- generally plain language (Q&A) is better
- better explain the observation time measurement

2. boat CTG out for comment – Tony speaking with NMMA contact next week

- states can be more stringent than CTG recommendations, so may not want weak CTG; otherwise states might try to reinforce or strengthen the rules state-by-state, resulting in inconsistent rules
- Tony will share other comments with John, just let him know

3. plating notification

- If company has both dry machining and wet machining, do they meet dry under 6W and wet under 6X?
- 6X only applies if NAICS is on the list

4. Paint rule petition status

- Len and Sharon discussing detail required
- meeting next week and hope clarification will be available soon
- Tony – Sherwin Williams contact sent email = orange and yellows ALL have lead chromate, and believes that's true of all suppliers
- Steve – thought waterborne might eliminate the HAPs
- (NOTE: Todd Nein followed up further on the waterborne paints, and his Sherwin Williams contact (same as Tony's?) indicated he didn't know of any paint system that was able to replace those HAPs.)
- Tony's talking to shops that may have to close unless they turn away orange and yellow jobs.
- Why couldn't EPA include a flat exemption level in rule?
 - Sharon – because of the listing as an area source category, it was based on the full universe no matter the size in order to achieve 90% reduction of HAPs

5. Chemical Mfg rule package

- Sharon will share a summary on rule from writer (Randy) and we can talk about tools that might be needed
- FR expected next week

6. Tony – auto DVD from CRC

- thoughts on what is shown in the video
 - nitrile gloves vs latex?
 - spring loaded cans (show if described)
