- 1) Approval of Minutes from January 11, 2005: Motion to approve minutes from January 11, 2005 was made by Terry, seconded by Francis, approved by the group.
- 2) Awards Committee: The nomination forms and instructions are now on-line. The Small Business award category has not changed significantly. There have been changes to the SBO/SBAP awards. There will be one award for an individual from the National SBAP; one award for an individual from a State SBAP; one award for a SBAP State Program; and one award for a Trade Association. Nominations are now open.
- 3) Multi-media Group: There will be a demo of the on-line Peer Match Center at the meeting in Biloxi. They will be asking for comments from the mentor programs and the attendees in Biloxi.
- 4) Technical Committee:
 - A. Area Source ID Project. Only 12 States have reported their numbers. Please ask your member States to respond with numbers or decline participation by March 15, 2005.
 - B. Auto Body NESHAP: Kim Teal has asked if the record keeping requirements in the misc. plastics rule would be appropriate for the auto body shops. This will be discussed at their next meeting.
 - C. Technical Sessions at Biloxi will include a session on Auto Body NESHAP.
 - D. Title V Area Source Deferrals. USEPA is recommending deferral of the TV requirements for 5 of the 6 area source categories currently under consideration. The rule has not yet been officially proposed. Please check with your State agencies to determine how they are handling the process.
 - E. USEPA has decided to remove tri-butyl acetate from the VOC list. However, they still want facilities to track and report these emissions. The Technical Committee is working with manufacturers of the chemical on language for MSDS that might be able to alert facilities about this distinction.

- F. There was a very nice report given by STAPPA-ALAPCO on the Dry Cleaners' Residual Risk. Technical Committee is looking to see if they can get a link to that information on the website.
- G. Technical Committee is keeping an eye on the situation surrounding Major Sources of HAPs that are not subject to any MACT standards.
- H. USEPA has new stack data on Ready-mix Concrete plant emissions they plan to use for AP-42 factors. Tony Pendola is the EPA contact for this information.
- 5) ENCAP: The next meeting will be in March 2005. Jim Leglar (sp?) is drafting a letter asking for the Area Source ID Data submittals from the States. This information needs to be submitted by March 15, 2005.
- 6) Annual Conference in Biloxi: The planning is going smoothly. The web site is up. The registration site will be up soon. Hotel information is already on the site. Travel scholarship information will also be coming soon. They will be finishing up the agenda shortly. Looking at some field trip options. May try to get a link between the Conference web page and the Awards web page.
- 7) Annual Conferences 2006 and 2007. There are three proposals for 2006 and 2007. Each State will be able to cast one vote for the 2006 location and one vote for the 2007 location.
- 8) Dry Cleaners Residual Risk (Digest version): USEPA is under court order to change the Dry Cleaner NESHAP for Major Sources, not Area Sources. In the process, USEPA is conducting a Residual Risk analysis for both Major and Area sources even though they are only required to do so for Major sources. The revised rule will address primarily Major sources, but may have some revised leak detection and repair requirements for Area sources. There may also be some significant requirements for those facilities co-located with residential or childcare facilities.
- 9) Area Source ID Project: Send in your information by March 15, 2005
- 10) ECOS Survey. The State responses to the 2000-2003 ECOS Survey on enforcement and compliance assistance was due at the end of January.
- 11) Karen, Rob, Ron, and Jay will have a meeting on Multi-media funding February 10 and 11.
- 12) Annual SBAP reports will not be completed on-line this year. Please complete the Word or WordPerfect document and e-mail it back by March 31, 2005. Hopefully this will cut down on some of the difficulties experienced in past years.
- 13) The President's proposed budget to Congress includes a 30% cut in the budget to OPEI.
- 14) A reminder about the Air Toxics workshop coming up March 29 - April 1, 2005 in RTP will be coming through Karen.
- 15) Area Source ID Project: Richard just got a message from Keith Barnett. Please send in your data by March 15, 2005 – or by Thursday of this week if possible.
- 16) Four or five members of this group will be attending the One Conference in Chicago.
