Water Discharges

- GENERAL PERMITS - Broad Menu
 - Sanitary
 - Construction Stormwater
 - Industrial Stormwater
 - Carwash
 - Light Commercial Facilities (Multiple)
 - Sand & Gravel Extraction
 - Automotive Dealerships
 - Cement, Concrete, and Asphalt Plants

Water General Permit Advantages

- Easy to obtain - NOIs and GP copies on Internet, quick review
- Automatic renewal every 5 years (mostly)
- Some have automatic coverage 48 hours after submittal (if complete)
- Fixed fees, invoiced after issuance

Air Emissions

- Act 918 EXEMPTS small sources from permitting if PTE
 - < 5 TPY of any regulated pollutant
 - < 16 TPY of ALL regulated pollutants
 - < MER of any state/federal air toxic
 - NOT already subject to Title V
- Source keeps proof of applicability
- Source still subject to air rules

Air Emissions

- Standard Oil & Gas (SOGA) permits
 - Similar to a "general" permit
 - Minor and non-Title V sources eligible
 - Sources responsible for emission limits
 - Sources responsible to modify permit
 - Application review & approval is fast
- BIG ADVANTAGE: Sources can make equipment and/or emission changes without prior LDEQ approval as long as SOGA eligibility maintained ©

Air Emissions

- Air Permitting Data Upload (APDU)
 - Permit applicants can now prepare & submit electronic EIQ data sets
 - APDU hosted on LDEQ server, user logon
 - Data accessible to applicant & permit writer allows for pre-submittal review & correction
 - Importable into TEMPO permit writing tool
- BIG ADVANTAGE: Permit writers spend less time in technical review and TEMPO data entry - permits issued faster ©
